The HempsteadWorks Career Center is offering *online* free training to prepare eligible residents of the Town of Hempstead and the City of Long Beach for demand occupations and careers with growth potential. Training is provided online by local colleges, public and private schools. Courses provide skills and certifications for a variety of fields.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to be considered for enrollment, applicants must be over age 18, register with HempsteadWorks under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), and be:

1. Unlikely or unable to obtain or retain employment, that leads to economic self-sufficiency or wages comparable to or higher than wages from previous employment, through career services alone;
2. In need of training services to obtain or retain employment that leads to economic self-sufficiency or wages comparable to or higher than wages from previous employment;
3. Applicant must also possess the skills and qualifications to successfully participate in the selected program of training services;
4. Select a program of training services that is directly linked to the employment opportunities in the local area; and be
5. Unable to obtain other grant assistance for such services.

Males born after 12/31/1959 must provide proof of Selective Service Registration
