OUR MISSION:

Our mission is to ensure that skilled workers are available to employers, to help job seekers to find work, and to foster economic development.

BUSINESS SERVICES

The Business Services Team works with companies throughout Long Island. In cooperation with our partners, we assist businesses with workforce development including recruitment and retention.

We help find qualified employees by posting open positions on the New York State Department of Labor's Job Bank, as well as host hiring events both virtual and in-person.

We also support diverse training programs including Internship, On-the-Job training, Transitional Jobs Program and Customized Training.



INTERNSHIP

An internship is a planned, structured experience that takes place in a workplace for a limited period of time. HempsteadWorks pays for the wages.



ON THE JOB TRAINING

On-the-job Training (OJT) is training by an employer that is provided to a paid participant while engaged in productive work in a job that provides skills essential to adequately perform a job. Employers may be reimbursed up to 50% of the trainee depending on company size.



TRANSITIONAL JOBS PROGRAM

Transitional jobs are a time-limited work experience for individuals with barriers to employment to help workers reintegrate into the workplace. HempsteadWorks pays the wages of all transitional workers.



CUSTOMIZED TRAINING

Customized Training (CT) is training designed to meet the special requirements of an employer and is conducted with a commitment by the employer to employ or maintain the employment of an individual upon successful completion of the training.
